

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1. Brief Particulars of the College:

The Bhayyaji Pandharipande National Institute of Social Work was established in 1968. Institute was founded by Late Adv. Ishwarbabu Deshmukh. The institute is affiliated to Rashtrasant Tukodoji Maharaj Nagpur University and recognized by Government of Maharashtra. The institute also recognized under section 2(f) and 12(b) of University Grants Commission Act, 1956. It has been accredited with the B+ Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore in 2004 and Re-accredited in the year 2011 with B grade and in 2018 with A Grade in 3rd cycle.

The institute offers BSW and MSW level academic programme. The BSW programme offered with the aim of preparing generalist Social Work Practitioners whereas MSW programme is offered with the aim of preparing advanced specialist Social Work practitioners with a focused training in one or two areas of concentration.

The institute organizes a <u>Brief Meets</u> for the students and parents and <u>Education Plus</u> programmes in the campus. A yearlong personality development under CLASS (Cultivating Leadership Ability and Skills Set) is emphasized. The quality of higher education in the institute opens a new page in the career graph of each and every student by nurturing the aspirations of the students for a social work profession; success becomes a matter of course.

The institute conducts following courses besides mentioned above-

- 1. Dialysis Technician Assistant Course (Add on course) since 2013 -14
- 2. Elderly Care Attendant course (Add on course) since 2013-14
- 3. BRIDGE- Vacational Training Programme (Value added course) since 2017-18.
- 4. Certificate Course in family Counseling (Add on Course) from 2018-2019

Details of the courses are as Follows:

- 1. Daialysis Technician Course: This six months certificate course was started in the year 2013-14 in collaboration with Nephrology society of India (Vidarbha chapter). During the academic session 2019-20.Total 17 students were admitted to the course.This course conducted during the period from July 19 to December 2019.
- 2. Elderly Care Attendent Course: During this session one training course was conducted from 3rd of October to 10th of October 2019 for Elderly Care Attendants, at the institute. A course covering modules on Nursing Care, Physical & Mental Health Problems of Elderly, How to take care of Elderly, First Aid etc. Total 40 members joined the course and completed successfully.
- **3. BRIDGE Vocational Training Programme:** This course was started during 2017-2018 under CSR Scheme with co-llaboration of BOSCH India Ltd. The third batch started on

1st March 2020, but due to the impact of COVID-19, we could not complete the training till the date. This course covering the modules on Soft Skills, Industry Overview and Internship. Total 28 trainees' registerd for the course.

4. Certificate Course in Family Counseling: This course was started from last session i.e. from 2018-19. The course is affiliated by Department of Life Long Learning and Extension, RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur. In this session (2019-20), Total 50 students joined the course and completed successfully. The course conducted during the period from October 2019 to March 2020.

The vision and mission of the institute is in tune with the National Education Policy, 1986. The nature of social work is such that occures holistic development of personality of the students. The social work syllabus is reviewed and updated periodically.

In addition to this, the institution offers bridge courses; value added courses, innovative courses and modular courses for the total development of personality. These courses definitely enhance the employability of the students.

2. Support Services Available:

The students of reserved category are eligible to get the post-higher secondary scholarship from the Ministry of Social Welfare, Govt. of India. The students are encouraged to participate in all curricular and co-curricular activities, through individual counseling and small group interventions. The Library is all set to cater to the needs of students by implementing schemes such as a Book Bank Scheme, Internet Access Center and a scheme of making available the reference materials for Xeroxing purposes. The college has the record of Alumni & the prominent positions held by them. The college has assisted in formulating the Alumni Association of B.P. National Institute of Social Work, Nagpur. The Employment and Guidance Bureau of the college registers the names of the needy students for employment purpose & organizes lectures for them to enable them to confidently face the selection process. The campus interviews are also facilitated.

3. Highlights:

- College organized various social awareness programmes in Nagpur City.
- The college has initiated Field Action activities. Elderly Care and Ortho Appliances Center has been launched with a view to provide meaningful field work training facilities to the students as well as to serve the community.
- An effective mentoring programme has been introduced at the college from the session 2009-2010. Mentoring programme is advocated as a strategy for improving competencies of students.
- The institute introduced specially designed entrance test called Social Work Entrance Examination [SEE] for admission to BSW part I and MSW part I courses.
- The Institute has introduced compulsory course in Environmental Studies for BSW-II (now ivth semester) students from 2007-08. As a part fulfillment of the requirement set by RTM Nagpur University total 48 students were admitted to the course during the current session.

- Two Compost Pits are made in the college premises. The students and staff worked hard to make this possible. Garden waste will be deposited in these pits and mannuare will be used for the garden of the college.
- The Institute has got approval of as place of Higher learning and Research Center from Rashtrasant Tukdoji Maharaj Nagpur University.
- Two Solar Power Lights have been installed in the college premises.
- Wi-Fi facility to all is being provides.
- Use of LED Bulbs in the college.
- Made the medicinal plants garden by Rotaract Club.

4. NAAC Accreditation and IQAC:

As a part of Accreditation & Evaluation of Higher Education Institutions, the Institute had been awarded B+ grade by NAAC, Bangalore in May, 2004. The college was awarded B Reaccreditation grade in March 2011 in 2ndcycle and awarded Re-creditation with A grade in February 2018 in the 3rd cycle.

The college has also constituted IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell) as recommended by NAAC and the same has been serving in a vital way in achieving the goal of excellence in higher education.

The primary aim of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalyst action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution.

Following strategies have been adopted by IQAC which shall involve mechanism and procedure for:

- 1. Ensuring time, efficient and progressive performance of academic, administrative and financial task.
- 2. The relevance and quality of academic and research programmes.

5. Beginning of the Session:

6. ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

A) Admissions: BSW LEVEL (UG LEVEL)

Institute has its own admission policy and procedure. Admission procedure for BSW-I classes started immediately after the declaration of the result of H.S.S.C. in the month of June 2019, prescribed application forms were distributed. The students were selected for admission to

Bachelor of Social Work on the basis of their academic record and through interview. A list of 60 selected candidates was displayed on notice board. Total 54 eligible candidates were selected for BSW-I, for BSW-II 33 and for BSW-III 41 eligible candidites were enrolled for the course through selection process.

10. Library:

The college has a well-equipped library, with over **14,230 books** of relevance to the profession of social work. The library is computerized. The institute has installed the library software LIB-MAN. It has an inbuilt module for the data entry, data analysis and the report generation. The special feature of the library is that it has an open access to the students and the attendant is always at the counter to assist with locating books and its prompt delivery.

In the session 2019-20, library has 05 life membership journals, 20 periodicals, 12 journals, 12 Magazines, 1 year book and 35 free magazines and has books of 9330 titles a rounding of 12426 no. of books. F) Students Research Projects

The students Research Project is a compulsory part of the syllabus of BSW-III & MSW-II. The Research activities in the college are promoted by encouraging the final year students of B.S.W. and Post Graduate students to participate in project work. Project work conducted by our students (including BSW-III & MSW-II) on (12+55) = 67 titles during the academic session with the guidance of respective supervisors. The students worked on different social issues, which are affecting the masses and came out with significant findings. We hope that the research conducted by the students will be helpful to the Government for policy making. The research reports are kept in the college library for the use of those interested in it.

13. Extension Activities of the College:

The college has initiated following field action extension activities with a view to provide meaningful field work training facilities to the students as well as to serve the community.

The various Outreach programmes of the college are;

A) Village Adoption Programme:

- Adoption of the village Borgaon Kalandri situated on Nagpur Umred road about 32 km from the college.
- Aims at the socio-economic uplift of the village in phases.
- Phase 1 : empowering the women and children of the neighbourhood, evolving a mutually enriching college-neighbourhood network, Providing training in vermicompost, manufacture, Organizing classes on floral arts and crafts, Engaging remedial classes, Conducting socio-economic survey, Undertaking rural reconstruction programme and water shed management.
- Phase 2: Installed Sanitary Napkin Machine in the Grampanchayat premises for the benefit of Women in the Village. Falicitated the students of Zilla Parishad High School, Borgaon who performed well in academic activities. Organized training programme of making washing powder fot the youth in the village.
- Phase 3: organized Yoga Training to the villagers specially youth by Mrs. Sangita Mishra of Pantanjali Yoga Samittee, Umrer. organized various programmes such as Health Cheak-up Camp, Shramdan, Gramswacchata Abhiyan, Lecture on Employment Opportunities to village youth, social awreness programmes related to Dowery, Alcholism, Casteism, various governmental schemes etc.

B) ELDERLY CARE AND ORTHO APPLIANCES PROJECT:

This project has been started from July 2009 for senior citizens. The Institute in association with Rotary club of Nagpur Down Town has given shape to a new field action project and is named as "Center for Elderly Care and Ortho Appliances". It has been observed that with the changing times, the issue of the care of the elderly and looking after them has assumed serious dimension. Their problems go unnoticed and even the equipments useful for them do not become easily available. Under the circumstances, this center proposes to provide them the necessary medical equipments. The center also offers the services to the elders, expert's advice and counseling as well as training for the voluntary social workers in elderly care.

C) **<u>ROTARACT CLUB BPNISW:</u>**

Total 37 students (including 21girls & 16 boys) with two faculties participated in the tour. Prof. A. A. Sargar was the Incharge assisted by Dr. Rekha Jagnade.

Main objectives of the educational tour was

Educational tour is a compulsory part of MSW Part II (semester IV^{th)} as a part fulfillment of the syllabus prescribed by the Rashtrasant Tukodoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

In the academic year 2019-20, an Educational Tour of MSW- IVth semester was organized at Nagpur – Wardha region on 27th February and 28th January, 2020. During this period

student were visited various NGO's as a part of their study and also enjoyed sightseeing's in areas of **Wardha**.

The educational tour is aimed, to provide an exposure to students to study and appreciate efforts by individuals and groups towards intervention, meeting people's core needs, and to initiate social development.

Learner Objectives:

The objectives of the learner behind organizing educational tour are as follows:

- 1. To develop knowledge of developmental organizations' and service agencies those have come up in relation to specific problems situations in the areas of rural/urban/tribal such as local government, panchayat raj institutions, voluntary agencies etc.
- 2. Understand the developmental organizations' philosophy, policy, structure, strategies, programmes, style of functioning and process of intervention in relation to the client system and the problem situation.
- 3. Acquire skills in planning, organizing, implementing the tour in respect to conscious use of time, communication skills, team spirit, handling conflicts and differences of opinion, decision making, evaluation, appreciation sharing of resources, sharing of talks, coping skill in problem situation, working through crisis situation and co-operation and co-ordination etc.
- 4. The student must be fully involved in planning and implementing the plans regarding the tour, with the active help of the faculty.
- 5. Learning to take the responsibilities on behalf of others.

During the educational tour, following agencies were visited by the students and collected relevant information by observing and collecting facts from the agencies administration.

1. : Achary Vinobaji Bhave's Ashram Pavnar:

Vinoba Bhave set up his Pavnar ashram in 1938 at the bank of Dham River which is 9 kms. of Wardha and 6 kms. away from Sewagram. Vinobaji was mainly observing Satyagraha and doing spiritual work in Pavnar ashram. Pavnar is the capital of Vakataka dynasty during the region of king Pravarsena. During the excavation for construction of the ashram, many sculptures and idols were found which are restored and displayed at the ashram for public view. When Gandhiji started the individual Satyagraha in 1940, Vinobaji was selected as the first individual Satyagrahi. Vinobaji Started a Bhudan Movement (Land Gift) in 1951 and related activities from this ashram. Bramha Vidya Mandir is located within the premises of Pavnar Ashram. This was established by Vinoba Bhave in 1959. It is now run by women from different states of India for common spiritual attainment. The women live a deeply contemplative life by contributing to the cause of the society. The women are actively involved in Rishi Kheti (i.e. earning livelihood from

farming with simple, inexpensive tools, without the help of bullocks that are within the reach of the poor), spinning, manual labor and other works related to the management of the ashram.

2. Center of Sciences for Villages, Maganwadi, Wardha:

Center of Sciences of Villages (CSV), started functioning in 1976 by its founder Chairman and Director Late Dr. Devendra Kumar from the premises of Maganwadi in Wardha from where Mahatma Gandhi began the All India Village Industries Association (AIVIA) in 1934 and Dr. J.C.Kumarappa gave shape to Gandhian concept of Rural Economy. The idea behind the centre was to establish a place, which could act as a center for transfer of technology and be a bridge between the portals of National Laboratories and doors of the Rural Mud Huts. Vision and Mission of center of Sciences are as follows:

- To work towards a holistic and futuristic development of the small community based centralized village economy.
- To develop and demonstrate appropriate rural technologies which are ecologically sound, economically viable and socially just.
- To develop the villages and arrest the erosion of its talent by promoting rural non-farm activities.
- To collect and document scientific and technological information for rural areas, by establishing a good database and information system and dissimilate the same through publications.
- To provide a forum to rural innovation with specialists and experts in science and technology, to provide them with necessary science and technology inputs to optimize innovated processes and products.

Since last three decades CSV is working on Rural Technologies, specially doing Research, Field Trials, Field Extension, Networking, Training, Publications and Policy intervention. The institute's Dattapur campus organize wide variety of activities exhibiting the application of alternate technologies for rural areas both through models as well as through hand on practices in their own facilities. CSV also provides training to artisans, self help groups, micro-entrepreneurs and development practitioners on alternate technologies.

3. Leprosy Hospital cum Rehabilitation Training center, Manohar Dham, Dattapur, Wardha:

Leprosy hospital cum rehabilitation training center was run by Maharogi Sewa Samittee born out of the first indigenous effort to take up leprosy service in India. This institute founded by Shri Manohar Balwant Diwan in 1936, it was considered to be a pioneering effort under one of the important constructive programme of Mahatma Gandhi and Vonoba Bhave. The institute was formulated on the principles of Sarvodaya. The main aim of foundation of this institute behind was Mr. Diwan noticed many leprosy affected people begging, one day he saw a leprosy patient quenching his thirst from a gutter, because he was not allowed to take water from a public tap. This came as a shock to Diwan and he took a vow to change the fate of lepers. He set up center to meet and treat patients at Yelakeli, Yaygaon, Kharangana, Sello, Sindhi, Hinganghat, Anji and Deoli and finally established a full-fledged leprosy hospital-cum- rehabilitation training center at Dattapur. Now a day's 105 patients' are taking medical treatment and rehabilitees in the institute.

4. Bapukuti Campus Visit at Sewagram, Wardha

When Mahatma Gandhi stared his padyatra (foot march) in 1930 from Sabarmati Ashram to Dandi for the Salt Satvagraha, he had decided not to return to Sabarmati till independence for India was not attained. Independence was not attained at that time and Gandhi was imprisoned for more than two years. On his release he spent some time travelling. He decided to make a village in Central India his head quarter. He came to Wardha in 1934; at the invitation of Shri Jamnalalji Bajaj. In April, 1936, Gandhiji established his residence in the village Shegaon which is he renamed as Sewagram, which means 'Village of service'. Gandhiji was 67 years old when he came in Sewagram. From then on, Sewagram has become an inspiring place. Many decisions on import anti national matters and movement were taken at Sewagram. It became the central place for a number of institutions for the nation building activities devised by Gandhiji to suit the inherent strength of this country. This Gandhi Ashram was the second place to Mahatma Gandhi. Main attraction being the Bapukuti which houses most of the personal artifacts used by Gandhiji. One of the unique things kept here is the massage table and the pot that Gandhiji used. The walls are well decorated and the overall atmosphere is sublime and serene. You may find a few people handling the Charkha. A prayer meeting is held once in morning and once in the evening. The places designated to Gandhiji's secretary- Mr. Mahadebhai Desai, Bapu Kuti- residence of Gandhiji, Ba-kuti- house of Kasturba Gandhi, last residence of Gandhiji, Prayer place, Nayee Talim etc.

5. Achary Vinoba Bhave Rural Hospital, Sawngi(Meghe), Wardha:

Acharya Vinoba Bhave Rural hospital is a 1525 bedded fully equipped teaching hospital attached to the medical college with state of the art facilities. It also acts as the teaching hospital for the Dental, Nursing and Physiotherapycolleges which are located in the same campus. Its motto is "Cure with Care" and it is certainly living up to the same with the help of its dedicated of highly qualified, skilled, experienced doctors and technicians. It offers super specialty treatment in the form of advanced surgeries such as renal transplant, joint replacement, corneal transplant, endoscopies' and laparoscopic and plastic surgery. This institute collaborated with many projects

such as Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan, RSBY National Rural Health Mission, and Sickle Cell Project Smile etc. Following Public Health Schemes implemented in the hospitals.

- Dattatraya Arogya Dattak Yojana (DADY): Dady cardholders are provided with free fluids, free beds, free investigations and free operation except some specialized investigations. Up to date near about 25360 (population 104000) cards were distributed in 20 adopted villages in Wardha Taluka and Slums of Wardha city.
- Vande Matram Scheme for all Patients: under this scheme normal delivery with or without episiotomies are done free of charge. All pregnant women are took benefit who coming for delivery in the hospital. The aim behind implementing this scheme that Wardha has high maternal mortality rate and have more than 70% anemic pregnant women. Thus this scheme has been started to reduce maternal mortality.
- Family Card Holder Scheme: 51778 family members had benefited under this scheme to cater to the need of population who are in the vicinity of the hospital and mainly residing in Wardha district.
- Sanjeevani Scheme: under this scheme 80 items including essential drugs and other consumables are provided free to all patients admitted to medicine ward. All pediatric clients getting admitted in pediatric ward including NICU, PICU. Reason for implemented this scheme to reduce the cost of health services this scheme has been initiated which will promote affordability of health services.
- Kawach Kundal Yojana: The scheme implemented for to promote hygiene practices and prevent infection to the newborn among the illiterate, poor patients in area. Under this scheme, a complete set of soft cotton clothes for a newborn as a gift and free immunization. Beneficiaries' are the every baby which has born in this hospital.

During the study tour students were also visited some religious, historical places and sightseeing' such as Geetai Mandir, Inter National Peace Buddha Stup, Bor Damp etc.

In this tour, total 41 students (including 30 girls and 11 boys) of Community Development and Medical and Psychiatric Social Work elective with two teaching staff members were participated. The tour was successfully organized with the co-operation of the students and faculty.
