Feedback from Alumni 2021-22:

ANALYSIS:

There are 8 questions in the feedback form. Collection of feedback forms has been done by the faculty of the college. According to the analysis following major points has been noticed. For the 3 questions asked in the feedback from four options as –Highly Relevant, Relevant, Not relevant and No Opinion are given to them for their answer. Similarly two questions were asked to find out their opinion and four options were given as Very Good, Good, Poor and No opinion. In third set of questions two questions were asked which were open ended. The answers to these questions are grouped in four categories. Following is the percentage wise analysis of the options of the question asked to the Alumni.

Feedback From Alumni 2021-22:

ANALYSIS:

Alumni feedback was collected during the months of March 2022. Dr. A.S. Barde, In charge of the Alumni committee collected the feedback and analyzed with the help of office staff. The purpose of this activity was to get the opinion of Alumni on various issues pertaining to the institute. Total 56 alumni participated in the survey. In all eight questions were put in the feedback. Following is the analysis of the feedback done by faculty members of the institute.

The important question was asked whether Field work training is significant for the job presently performing by you? To this question the alumni responded as “Highly Relevant” = 19.3%, “Relevant”=57.9%, “No opinion”= 10.7% and remaining “Not relevant” =12.1%. The data reveals that majority of the alumni are of the opinion that while doing job they find that field work training is significant. As regards to significance of research project, the data shows that 32.8% of them find highly relevant while performing job. 55.2% also found it is Relevant, 1.7% had no opinion on the question while remaining 10.3% found that it is not relevant. The data clearly indicates that majority of the alumni found it is relevant. The alumni responded to the question – significance of social work course to the present job they are performing. Only 3.2% of them had no opinion, while 12.1% opined that it is not relevant. 70.7% and 14% opined it is highly relevant and relevant respectively. As regards to the question about on the Library was sought. Data reveals that 24.6% said that it is Very Good, 63.2% said it is good, 1.7% had no opinion to offer while 10.5% regarded it as Poor. The finding needs to be taken for consideration for corrective measures. Similarly opinion about their feelings as far as college administrative office is concerned, 51.7% of them said that it is Very Good, 32.8% said it is good while 1.7% had no opinion to express on this and remaining 13.8% graded it as “Poor”. Finding shows that no need of correction in the office administration.

The question was asked to the Alumni whether they feel proud to be Alumni of this institute, 87% of them responded positively and said “Always” while remaining 13% expressed their inability to respond and said “Can’t say”. Specific question was asked to them as to how can you extend help to the institute. The question was open ended. Their suggestions are grouped as following –

1. For the continuous development of the institute can give new ideas.
2. Can motivate future students to take admission to social work course at BPNISW.
3. To give fee waiver to help poor students.
4. Can develop soft skills in student’s field and employment.
5. Can help the institute in organizing rural camps and educational programs. Another open ended

question was asked to them as what are the main drawbacks of this institute? The responses are grouped as following-

1. Field work training should not suitable for providing employment to the students in future.
2. Institute is unable to provide hostel facility to the outside students.
3. Majority of the students of the institute is not serious to attend regular classes and field work.
4. Institute need to modify the classroom furniture.
5. Non availability of internet connection for the students.

Action Taken Report 2021-22

1. According to the employment policy of the government, there are continuous decreasing opportunities in social work. This policy of government should be openly opposed by the institute by various efforts.
2. Field work training is not suitable for providing employment to the students in future. So principal and all teachers decided that all supervisors should choose this type of field work agencies which is able to provide field work experiences like making students employable in future.
3. On the issue of Institute is unable to provide hostel facility to the outside students. The construction of hostel in the college has started since many days. Work has stopped due to lack of funds. As soon as sufficient will available, we will be able to provide hostel facility.
4. Majority of the students of the institute are not serious in studies. Necessary instructions were given to teachers for increase their enthusiasm and improve their attendance.
5. In the meeting of the Library Committee, emphasis was laid on providing funds and spending for the purchase of books in languages other than English.
6. Funds were made available for repairing and purchase of old furniture in the college.
7. To provide free Wi-Fi facility to the students studying in the college, in the meeting Internal Quality Assurance Council (IQAC) of the College, the decision was passed and necessary instructions were given to make the funds available.
