II : INTRODUCTION

A) About the Institute :

The B.P. National Institute of Social Work was established in 1968. The Institute was founded by late Adv. Shri Ishwarbabu Deshumukh. The Institute is affiliated to RTM Nagpur University and recognized by Govt. of Maharashtra, and under section (2)f of University Grant Commission Act 1956. The Governing Legislation of the college is Maharashtra Universities Act 1994. It has been Re-Accredited with the B Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore in 2010.

The Institute offers BSW and MSW level academic program. The BSW Program is offered with the aim of preparing generalist Social Work practitioners whereas MSW program is offered with the aim of preparing advanced specialist Social Work practitioners with a focused training in one or two areas of concentration.

The Institute organizes a '**Briefing Meets**' for students and parents and '**Education Plus**' programs on the campus. A year long personality development under CLASS (Cultivating Leadership Ability and Skill Set) is emphasized. The quality of higher education in the institute opens a new page in the career graph of each and every student. By nurturing the aspirations of the students for a Social Work profession, success becomes a matter of course.

B) Vision :

The Vision of the Institution is *"Determined for excellence in Social Work Education"*

C) Mission :

The Mission of the Institution is we at BPNISE Shall work continuously to achieve.

1. To impart quality Social Work Education.
2. To introduce newer areas of academic pursuit with greater employability potential.
3. To introduce core values of higher education with a view to bring about holistic development of personality
4. Providing Social Work Education for both personal and social transformation.
5. Providing means for the up gradation of skills in order to increase the employability of the college students.

D) Core Values :

- An unwavering faith in Human dignity
- An abiding faith in duty towards other individuals and society

The vision and mission of the institution is communicated to the students, teachers, staff and other stakeholders through its publication in the prospectus, institutional website, advertisement in newspapers, Orientation programme and through Alumni Association of the institute.

The vision and mission of the institution is in tune with the National Education Policy, 1986. The nature of social work is such that there occurs holistic development of personality of the students. The social work syllabus is reviewed and updated periodically.

In addition to this, the institution offers bridge courses; value added courses, innovative courses, and modular courses for the total development of personality. These courses definitely enhance the employability of the students.

E) Infrastructure :

The Institute has its own building with excellent infrastructure on the plot about 2 acres in the prime location of Nagpur City. There are sufficient classrooms, Furniture, Audio Visual aids, and other equipments. The Institute has spacious play ground, Gymnasium, Auditorium and a multipurpose vehicle.

F) Outstanding Features :

1) Counseling and Placement Cell :

The placement cell functions with the objective of helping the students to have right communication between recruiting agencies and the students. Job related information is displayed on the notice board and personal counselling is rendered. The In-charge acts as facilitator.

2) Student's Counseling Center :

To provide counseling to the students, establishment of Students Counseling Center is the need of the hour. This college has firm faith in that a student who receives the best counseling can alone become eligible to receive qualitative education from the hands of his teachers.

3) Rural Study Camp:

Rural study camp is arranged for BSW II and MSW I based on the guidelines prescribed by the UGC Model curriculum in Social Work Education related to Social Work Practicum. It is a compulsory part of syllabus of Social Work Practicum of Nagpur University. Participation in rural study camp is compulsory.

4) Study Tour :

Educational study tour is a compulsory part of the syllabus of the Nagpur University at BSW-III and MSW-II level. There shall be no substitute for this activity.

5) Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

The College was granted B Re-accreditation grade in 2010. The IQAC is established in the College Steering committee, which as per the requirements of NAAC. It is striving to maintain the quality education in the field of Social Work Education.

6) Faculty :

The college has well qualified, dedicated teaching staff, who are engaged in different activities of the University like syllabus development, courses modification, paper setting , moderation, valuation of answer books of RTM Nagpur University. In Addition to this, the faculty represents the Board of Studies in Social Work, the Social Sciences Faculty, Academic Council, the Senate and almost all important bodies of RTM , Nagpur University.

7) Environment Education :

On the direction of RTM Nagpur University, the college has introduced the compulsory course of six months duration in environmental studies at Second year of BSW on the guidelines of UGC model to be implemented from the academic session 2013-14. This course consists of 50 lectures and spreads over six months at the rate of 4 lectures per week. At the completion of the course the student will be evaluated on the theory question paper which will carry 75 Marks for 50 objectives type of questions and 25 marks for one essay type question. Thus the student would be evaluated for 100 marks and would be awarded grade, which will be shown in his mark list issued by RTM Nagpur University.

8) National Service Scheme (NSS) :

The college unit of NSS is well recognized by the RTM Nagpur University. It regularly organizes NSS camps. The students of this college who are members of NSS unit, donate blood for needy patients, participate in Republic Day functions, tree plantation and traffic control.

III. General Information

a) Students Council :

Students Council is a body of elected students of the College. It is constituted as per Section 99 (3) of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016.

The College students Council shall consist of following members namely :-

- a) President, elected by an electoral college consisting of students who are engaged in full time studies in that college
- b) Secretary, elected by an electoral college consisting of students who are engaged in full time studies in that college :

c) one lady representative, elected by an electoral college consisting of students who are engaged in full time studies in that college.

d) one representative belonging to scheduled tribes or De-notified Tribes (Vimukta-Jatis) or Nomadic Tribes or other Backward Classes, by rotation, elected by an electoral college consisting of students who are engaged in full time studies in that college.

Provided that the University shall decide the category of reservation for each college for the purpose of this clause by drawing lots:

e) one student from each class, elected by an electoral college consisting of students who are engaged in full time studies in that class.

f) One student each from (a) National Service Scheme, (b) National Cadet Corps, (c) Sports and (d) Cultural activities, nominated by the Principal from the students who are engaged in National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps, Sports and Cultural activities, respectively, on the basis of prescribed criteria.

g) One senior teacher as coordinator of the Students Council appointed by the principal of the college and Director, Sports and Physical Education, NSS Programme Officer and NCC Officer as permanent invitees.

b) Students Aid Fund :

The Student Aid Fund provides aid to needy students in the form of fees, book and cash money.

c) Library :

The college has a well - equipped library, with over 14,602 books of relevance to the profession of social work. The Library is fully computerized. The Institute has installed the Library Software LIB-MAN. It has an inbuilt module for the acquisitions, cataloguing data entry, data analysis and the report generation. The special feature of the Library is that it has an open access to the students and the attendant is always at the counter to assist with locating books and in its prompt delivery. The new books acquired by the library are displayed for the benefit of the students and staff. The students are motivated to use the library facilities extensively. The Library is open from 10.30 am to 5.30 pm every day excluding Sundays. The library not only serves our own students but many scholars from different institutions and Universities also come to consult it.

IV. Admission Procedure :

An application for admission to BSW and MSW course must be submitted in the prescribed form of this institution within the stipulated date as may be notified by the Institute along with relevant certificates and the admission fees.

A student who has passed HSC examination or an equivalent examination and a graduate from any recognized University shall be eligible to seek admission for BSW Part I and MSW Part - I respectively.

- * **Admission of other than Nagpur University Students**
The students other than Nagpur University are admitted on production of eligibility certificate obtained from the RTM Nagpur University before the admission. Such candidates are required to pay the prescribe fee in the University.
- * **College Uniform (Dress Code) :**
The Institute has introduced uniform for the students from last academic session. The Students must wear uniform daily.
For Girls : Cream Colour KURTA and Black Colour SALWAR/LEGIN
For Boys : Black Colour TROUSER and Cream Colour SHIRT
- * **Cost of prospectus- cum-Application form :**
The prospectus-cum-Application form can be obtained from the date of declaration of HSC and University result on payment of Rs. 100/- (for MSW) and Rs. 20/- (For BSW) either personally or by post.
- * **Rules and Regulations**
 - All admissions are subject to the rules & regulations of the RTM Nagpur University and the final admission will be approved based on the criteria and submission of testimonials in original as stipulated by the University.
 - Fees ones paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
 - Payment of fees in time is the responsibility of student/ parent and delay of the same shall attract penal charges as decided by the Management from time to time
 - At least 75% attendance is must for the students to appear for University Examinations.
 - Students shall not be permitted for appearing in the University Examination if they fail to attend the test examination conducted by the college.
 - Indulging in smoking, consuming alcoholic / intoxicating drugs is strictly prohibited on the college campus.
 - Eve- teasing or any anti-social activities will attract severe punishment to the extent of debarring from the college.
 - Request for certificates, testimonials and other documents requiring the Principal's signature should be addressed to the Principal and submitted to the college office. A student desiring to obtain a certificate (Bonafide, Transfer, Conduct, Age etc) shall apply for it in prescribed form available in the college office. The application should be submitted along with a search fee of Rs. 20/-
